








YTAL Cross-country course An official Runner's Info running course begins just next to Shuzen-in Temple. Running this course is said to leave all your troubles in the dust!























Joge-cho White-Walled Townscape

Enjoy a historic and picturesque landscape that includes a romantic, white-walled townscape complete with the white plaster walls of old-fashioned storehouses and the lattice-work doors of homes.



Taishaku-kyo Gorge and Sightseeing Cruise

Taisfraku-kyo Gorge is counted among the top 100 landscapes and national parks of Japan. With Lish trees in summer and a brilliant splash of coder in automit follage. Flowering Fields of Sera Town

Fukuyama Castle

This famous castle will be commemorating 400 years of history in 2022. Located near Fukuyama Station, Fukuyama Castle includes a museum in the main keep that conveys the history of Fukuyama City through exhibitions featuring books and armor of the castle's historic lord.



Myoo-in Temple, a National Treasure

The eclectically styled main hall—regarded as the oldest temple main hall in Japan—and the five-storied pagoda—said to be the fifth-oldest pagoda in Japan—have both been designated national treasures.



Tomonoura

The Tomonoura port area has been used as the stage for numerous movies and dramas. The stunning view of the Seto Inland Sea and the historical landscape have earned Tomonoura the special title of a "healing" port town.



Horseshoe Crab Museum

Overlooking the Konoshima Channel, designated a national natural treasure as a breeding ground of horseshee crabs, the Horseshoe Crab Museum is the only horseshoe crab-themed museum in the world. Visitors will also find a park with full-sized dinosaur models nearby.



Sankei-en Park

To commemorate the opening of Hiroshima Airport, Sankei-en Park was opened in 1993 as a promenade-style garden complete with a hill and a pond designed after Hiroshima's scenic villages, mountains, and ocean.

Bisei Astronomical Observatory

Ibara Station / Denim shops

Selvedge denim made in Ibara is the highest grade of denim used in products from well-known brands throughout the world. Ibara Station's local bara denim shop has provided the station with a unique denim design.



Toyomatsu Kamihikoki Tower

Made as a launching point for paper airplanes (kamihikoki in Japanese), Kamihikoki Tower is one of the world's most unusual towers and measures some 26 m tall.



Kasaoka Islands

The Kasaoka Islands, located just off the coast in the Seto Inland Sea, is a beautiful collection of seven richly characteristic islands that form a truly majestic sight.
